- 4. **Essay**: An essay not to exceed 300 words, describing your educational/career goals and personal aspirations for making a difference in your community.
 - * If you have been awarded this scholarship before, you will need to write a new essay. In addition to describing your goals, please include in your essay how this scholarship has contributed to your ability to make a difference in your community.
